Biographies

There are currently five active volunteer members of CFUV Radio in the Postales Musicales de Latinoamérica Radio Show Collective. Three of the five have been hosting the show for more than a decade. All of the members are Canadian citizens, and participate actively in the Latin Victoria cultural scene.

- 2) Alberto Callo was born in Cusco, Perú in 1963. He is a Production Manager at Axys Technologies Inc., and an active soccer player. He comes from a family of talented musicians.
- 3) Chrissie Forster was born in England in 1971, but finished secondary school in a small town on the pampas of Argentina. She teaches Spanish Language, Hispanic Film, and Latin American Culture at the University of Victoria. She also enjoys practicing guitar, and meets weekly with Steven and Alberto to play Latin American folk songs.
- 4) Nadia Cornejo was born in El Salvador in 1987. She is an Administrative Assistant for the Provincial Government of British Columbia, and an active member of the University of Victoria Catholic Students Association (CSA).
- 5) Fabricio Sosa was born in Yucatán, México in 1966. He is a Community Mental Health Worker at Abilities Community Services, and has participated in the Rock Solid Anti-Bullying Campaign. In his free time he enjoys outdoor recreation.

Program Description

If there is one word that could describe the Postales Musicales de Latinoamérica Radio Show (broadcast every Sunday from 12:30 – 2:00pm (PT) on CFUV 101.9fm, or online at cfuv.uvic.ca), it would be "diverse".

Offering a variety of music, news and culture from throughout the Hispanic world, Postales Musicales de Latinoamérica (Musical Postcards from Latin America) is produced by a collective of five hosts who come from diverse backgrounds and experiences (male, female, Hispanic, Canadian, young, experienced, North, Central, South American, etc.). Each host brings a

unique musical perspective that is infused and informed by his or her own special interests, and this diversity creates a rich variety of programming. On any Sunday, listeners tune in to Postales Musicales to hear a mélange of musical genres that represent the distinct geographical and cultural regions of the Americas, including trova, tango, folklore, salsa, son, merengue, cumbia, samba, Afro-Peruvian rhythms, boleros, alternative rock, bachata, reggaetón, mestizo music, and much, much more.

Postales Musicales is not just about music. It is also about building cultural connections and relationships between the listeners and the Hispanic community. It is a completely bilingual show, and as such, appeals to Spanish and English-speaking listeners. The program features news, cultural information, sports highlights, and interviews from the local to the global. Since 1988, the program has produced dozens of on-air interviews with individuals and groups from the Latino-Canadian community. Examples of guests include:

Postales Musicales members also support community cultural events by volunteering as MC's / Guest Speakers / Hosts / Live DJ's at a variety of festivals and events connected to the Victoria Latino community. Examples include:

Committed to building community and supporting local arts and culture, Postales Musicales hosts have provided letters of support for grant applications for several of these non-profit cultural events. They have also maintained a number of community outreach projects over the years, such as a weekly on-air broadcast and online posting of the Calendar of Events, which

showcases and promotes cultural activities in the Victoria Latino Community. Furthermore, all of the Postales Musicales hosts have been dedicated to meeting public fundraising goals for CFUV Radio through the annual FunDrive campaign. They have also written CD reviews for CFUV's publication formerly known as "Renegade Radio", and produced special Hispanic content programs for the Women's Radio Collective, Black History Month, and the Annual Victoria Day Broadcast.

Through their program, the Postales Musicales team aims to raise awareness about the rich and diverse cultures that represent Latin America, as well as promote events in the local Hispanic community. This past year they have embarked upon a new collaborative project with Lina de Guevara, a professional Chilean-Canadian theatre director, to create "Radioteatro de Las Américas". This radio theatre group invites students and members of the community to participate in Spanish language theatre productions that are adapted for radio, then recorded and edited by CFUV's sound technician Ali López to be broadcast periodically on the show. This has been a rewarding experience for all those involved, and an important part of CFUV's diverse, multi-cultural programming.
